He was among the first forty boys to attend Dinthill Practical Training Center. To this day he fondly remembers the advertisement "Wanted boys that would become Men". As the school motto says, "Deeds over Words," that is exactly how Mr. Grange is living his

life and has exemplified that when he was living in Jamaica by giving back to his community through his involvement with helping youths accomplish their goals.

After graduation, he was a chief security officer for Alcan. His most precious memory was attending Dinthill Practical Training Center where he was awarded for never being late and perfect attendance. He was privileged to receive the award of one black Aberdeen cow, which he named Betsy. He recalls walking home with his precious cow and could not wait to tell his mother what he had won. Amongst this award, he also was recognized by the Rural Agricultural Development Authority in 2006 for his contribution to the development of the agriculture sector.

Mr. Grange migrated to the United States in the 1970's. While living in the United States, he established the Hartford Chapter Jamaica Progressive League, Inc, which he was the president of for many years. And received the Ethelred Brown Award for outstanding accomplishments and dedicated service to the Jamaica Progressive League.

Mr. Grange is know for his love for farming. There is not a day that goes by that Mr. Grange does not express his gratitude to Dinthill Practical Training Center for giving him the opportunity to be a part of such a great program that supported his passion for farming. His son, Duckworth Grange, still maintains his farm in Linstead Jamaica. And is very proud that his legacy remains. Mr. Grange is also known for his story telling of his life accomplishments and wisdom which he shares with his family and friends. His favourite quotes to his grandchildren are "if you can't be good, be careful" and "hitch your wagon to a star" and thus far his grandchildren are achieving just that. He is an inspiration to all and will continue to be an inspiration as he enjoys spending time with his family.

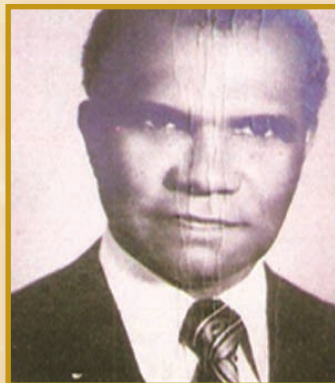

The dawn of a new era has come as the "Facta Non Verba" brand celebrates its 80th Anniversary with dignity and pride. The Dinthill Technical High School is embarking on a mission to foster a greater appreciation for the Technical Vocational assessment areas. With a greater demand for Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Dinthill is poised to fulfill its mandate.

Dinthill evolved from the desire to improve the educational opportunities available to the less privileged of the country. Subsequently, Sir Edward Brandis Denham, Captain General, and the Government of Jamaica during the period of 1934 - 1938 were responsible for this remarkable birth. Therefore, upon Sir Denham's directives this school began its operations on the Dinthill property which was purchased by the government along with 40 acres known as "Dee Side" from Mr. Wood, which in total amounted to 137 1/2 acres.

We've come this far by faith, Dinthill has been blessed with 16 principals to date: 11 appointed and 5 acting in state.

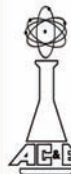

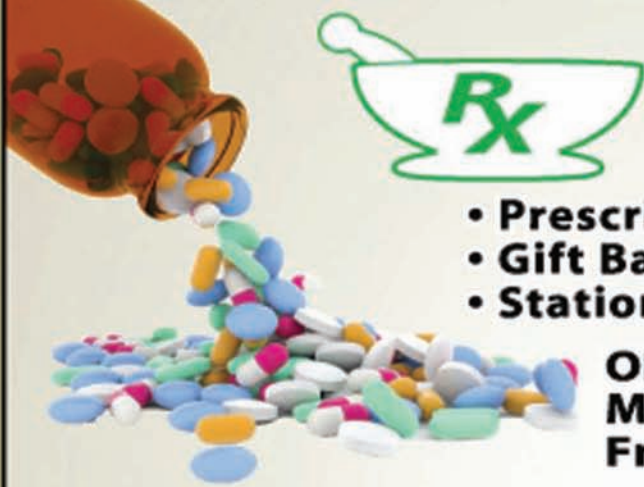

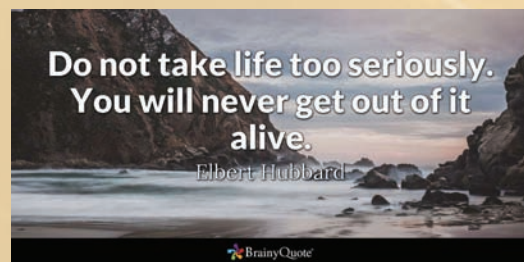
